Good readers use
six super strategies
to help them read
better.

Good readers make
predictions.

They think about what is going
to happen in a story based on
what they already know and
what they have read.

Good readers make
connections.

They make links between what
they are reading with what they
know, have read or have
experienced before.

Good readers **monitor**.

They stop to think about what they are reading and they know what to do when they do not understand. They clarify words that are not familiar.

Good readers

question.

They ask themselves questions
as they are reading.

Good readers

visualise.

They picture in their mind what
is happening in the story.

Good readers
summarise.

They identify the most
important points and state them
in their own words.
